SPECIAL "BACK TO POOL" ISSUE

Hello again, sea nymphs! And despite the fervent prayers of many, I have returned. Very special thanks to Sunfish, the Swamp Fox, Muffin, Thunder Thighs, and Captain America for filling in so ably in my absence. It has been a super summer, all of it spent on and in the water. But it is good to be back in the saddle again. I've missed the fun of giggleing to myself late at night as I battle the keys.

Northern Shores sent 20 swimmers to Dearborn, Michigan for the Long Course Nationals. At this writing, the team scores were not available, but the team probably finished 5th or 6th out of 100 teams. Ray Hakomaki won the 50m Free to be the only National Champion from Minnesota, but the kids from the North took 8 seconds: Mamie Brown in the 50 Free and 200 Back; Vion Kaye in the 100 and 200 Breast; Ray again in the 200 Breast; Warren Kaye in the 1500 Free; Marianne Schulze in the 100 Back; and the Women's 45 & Over 200 Free Relay of Eileen Sylvester, Carol Harris, Jean Cronje, and Vion Kaye. Third Places were won in 14 individual events, and by 6 relay teams. Look for the results in next mailing!

There were numerous highlights: every time Mamie Brown entered the water, it was special. There was a nifty thunderstorm on Thursday, which twice postponed the meet, and eventually caused the rescheduling of the last 3 events until the next day. Marsha Soucheray was swimming her 200 IM as a line squal came screaming across eastern Michigan: "I flipped over into my backstroke and all I could see was lightning."

Sue Sherin, Jean Cronje, Marianne Schulze, Vion and Warren Kaye, Roger Bosveld (who was disqualified in the 100m Back for allegedly pulling on the lane lines) all had super meets, with dozens of personal records. Robin Kleffman, Bill Earley, and Bob Davidson placed well and swam fast in the toughest men's age group, the 30 - 34's. Carol Harris was her usual steady (and fast) self, and carried the flag for Minnesota in the Opening Ceremony. We saw old friends (Former Minnesotans Gail Dummer and John Wanner) and made new ones (like the man who first beat Johnny Weismuller, Bill Prew; and Yvonne Cattrall, who may still have Bill Earley's room key down her suit -- but don't worry Brenda, Bill's was the 87th key to take the dive down her Speedo. And 80 year old Ruth Deal, who swam the 200 IM, with a butterfly split of about 20 minutes! And Jim Kervin of Wisconsin, who could teach the rest of the country about sportsmanship. And crazy Paul Windrath, who suited up in drag to be one of the two required females on the Beer Relay for the "victoriou Olympic Club. And the Henry Ford Museum, and Greenfield Village, with the first 200 steam engine powered electric dynamos ever built. If you've seen one steam engine powered dynamo, you've seen them all. But the cars, planes, stoves, sewing machines!

The trip, as in the past, was a smashing success, our only regret — the absence of other teams from Minnesota. You don't have to be great to have a great time. As we announce the dates and times of upcoming meets, get your friends together and haul a relay out to the Nationals. It is a trip you'll never forget.

As we promised in several announcements at the Nationals, we have the results of the BEER RELAY sponsored by the Rocky Mountain Masters. The Northern Shores Acorns finished in the top half of the 24 team heat, which was won by the bogus Olympic Club team, which boasted 4 of the top men sprinters in the meet, and for the two women who were to round out the team, they drafted Paul Windrath and some other closet transvestite.

Julie Johnston distinguished herself as a Power Chugger, and lots of credit should go to our team manager, Marianne Schulze, whose inspirational leadership and timely water splashing was a key to our success!
