Swim 4th 25

Locomotive to 4 & down 200 EZ

 $6 \times 50 \text{ on } 1:00$ 150 EZ Choice

"In a moment, page 2."

300 Warm-up

 30×50 on 1:00-1:15 as follows:

1-5 EZ

6-10 Steady & strong

11-16 Descend

17 & 18 Restricted Breathing

19-24 Moderate & steady 25-30 Descending & Fast
